Purpose

A longstanding collaboration between Cincinnati Children's, the University of Toronto/University Health Network, and Oregon Health & Science University, this rotating annual international symposium is the largest ACHD meeting in North America. Every third year, the conference is held in Cincinnati – we are thrilled to be back in-person.

Adults with congenital heart disease are a rapidly growing, understudied, and underserved population. This educational program is designed to meet the needs of trainees, established pediatric and adult cardiovascular physicians, advanced practice nurses and other nurses, physicians assistants, and other health professionals. The meeting will provide extensive didactic and collaborative opportunities for all of those who care for adults with congenital heart disease.

Objectives

By participating in this conference, attendees should be better able to:

- Recognize neurodevelopmental issues for persons with CHD and leverage resources to improve functioning
- Apply the latest pharmacologic and management strategies to treat pulmonary arterial hypertension in CHD
- Predict challenges in electrophysiology, percutaneous and hybrid interventions in the adult with CHD
- Utilize 3D models, multimodality imaging integration and virtual surgery to improve outcomes in CHD
- Incorporate the patient perspective in planning treatment
- Improve the effectiveness of cardiovascular team-based care
